And because food and sweets are an important part of the Mardi Gras tradition, the museum also will be serving King Cakes donated by Montgomery Bakehouse.

Mardi Gras activities are included in the museum's regular \$7 admission for visitors age 1 and older. Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
